Secretary Managers Report 2022

I present my report ending 31st March 2022. The operating profit for Nowra Bowling & Recreation Club after depreciation was \$78,095.00 compared to 2021 profit of \$180,261. Factors influenced both financial years. In 2021 the Club received allowances through Job Keeper and cash flow boost of \$329,929.00 while in 2022 we received \$135,938.00 in Job saver payments. I'm pleased that in the March quarter for 2022 the club was able to post a profit of \$46,493 with no government assistance.

Yearly Overview

Total revenue: decreased by \$11,655.00

Bar sales: increased by \$81,161.00

Gaming clearances: increased by \$329,879.00

2021/2022 has been a very challenging year with continued COVID-19 interruptions. Clubs, like many other businesses have felt the impact during this financial year. On August 14th 2021 the club was forced to close and remained closed for the next 8 weeks, reopening on Monday October 11th with restricted hours. The club was fortunate during that period we qualified for financial assistance through job saver payments, which helped pay employees and accounts during this time. Since reopening club trading has been positive and we hope that with consumer confidence financial growth continues in 2022/2023.

Through the remainder of 2022/2023 we will be addressing issues including the men's locker room, North East Wall; both of these projects are in consultation with local engineering firm SCI Engineer's. The Club will also continue to investigate and repair roofing concerns.

I would like to thank all the staff for your help and support over these 12 months, 2022/2023 will provide us with many challenges which we can face together.
